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Principal's Message

Kennedy Parents and Students,

Iwould like to welcome parents and students to the upcoming school year. There are a number of items on which I would like to inform parents. The incoming ninth grade students will all be assigned to teams that represent our Sports Medicine and Management, Media.com, Cambridge and Leadership Institute Academies. There will be a dedicated group of teachers assigned to working with a specified group of students on those four teams. In addition the Sports Medicine program will be broadened as a result of the Maryland State Department of Education approving Kennedy as a Medical Career site. Kennedy staff has also met with officials of Johns Hopkins University to establish

our school as a Professional Development Site. Kennedy will establish a parent information center that will be near the main office and will house representatives from the Hispanic, Korean and West African communities. These individuals will serve as both liaisons and interpreters to parents from the many different backgrounds that make up our community. Kennedy will also receive the services of an Education Facilities Officer (police officer) who will be housed at our school. As many of you know, a federal grant is in place to provide this service to all county high schools and this year 16 of the 23 MCPS high schools will benefit from this program.

Last spring the Kennedy staff determined that the most important area in which we must concentrate during the upcoming school year is in the area of literacy. Teachers will emphasize reading writing and math skills across

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all content areas all year. Parent and student representatives met with the Kennedy Leadership team over the summer and supported our emphasis on this area while also requesting that we concentrate on parent school communication. To that end, all ninth and tenth grade students will be issued writing handbooks as well agenda books during the first week of classes. Combined cost for both of these books will be \$20 and students can bring checks for this amount made out to Kennedy High School during the week of Aug. 30th. Our increased efforts in literacy should

have long range impact on our standardized test scores, and also allow individual students to achieve better results on key tests such as the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and on Advanced Placement (AP) Exams.

I am keenly aware that parents and students in the Down County consortium now have the ability to choose their own high schools. It is our duty to build Academy programs, provide career information and exposure, while at the same time building an outstanding comprehensive high school program. I look to the establishment of a parent-school partnership that best supports all of the needs of our students. **K**

MCPS Grading and Reporting Policy

High schools in Montgomery County are all being asked to implement a new Grading and Reporting Policy during the 2004-05 and 2005-06 school years. Under this policy students will have additional opportunities to retest if they do not initially master information, be provided with alternative assessments when appropriate, request additional time for completion of assignments and seek additional ways to demonstrate and achieve success in each course. At the same time the new policy will not allow students to be graded for simply completing their homework or for putting forth effort without demonstrating results. There is much new information that we will be discussing among our educational staff and with the student and parent communities.

Extracurricular Involvement

It is vitally important that all students participate in some sport and/or other extra curricular activity. College applications request this information, but more importantly students gain a more comprehensive view of school life when they participate in activities beyond their classes. Students who become involved in such activities have higher academic averages and also make close friends who become part of their support network. All ninth grade students should join one such activity as the school year begins and all other students should continue with their present activities, expand their interests to other areas, or begin their involvement for the first time. All fall sports begin their tryouts during the middle of August and students interested in joining such an activity must have an updated physical. **K**

HS Graduation Requirements

According to the Maryland State Dept. of Education, a senior must earn a minimum of 22 credits to be eligible for graduation. Those credits are as follows:

English4 credits

Social Studies3 credits (1 U.S. History, 1 NSL, and 1 Modern World History)

Science3 credits (1 Biology, 1 Physical Science and 1 other Science)

Mathematics4 credits (1 Algebra, 1 Geometry, and 2 other Math courses)

Physical Education1 credit

Fine Arts.....1 credit

Technology Education ..1 credit

Health1/2 credit

In addition to this 22 credit minimum requirement, students must have:

- Earned at least 4 credits beyond the completion of grade 11.
- Met High School Assessment requirement by taking appropriate end of year tests.
- Fulfilled a Maryland Program Completer requirement (Either 2.0 credits of foreign language OR 2.0 credits of advanced technology OR 3.0-9.0 credits toward a Career Development Program).
- Earned 60 hours of Student Service Learning (Should be from a MCPS approved site, otherwise student should complete application to do special activity and file with SSL coordinator).

Seniors are receiving letters regarding their specific credit situations during the last two weeks of August.

What should parents do if they have class scheduling questions?

Letters with students' 2004-2005 schedules will be mailed around August 13. Included will be a form to request

schedule changes and information on "Walk-in" times for schedule changes.

How can parents find out who is their child's counselor?

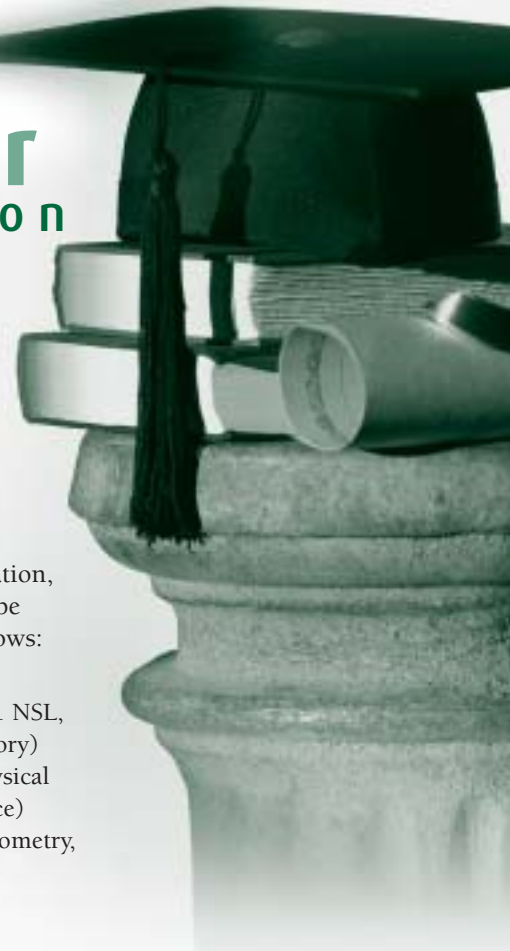
Each counselor has approximately 300 students with the exception of Mrs. Hunt, the resource counselor, who has 150 students.

SAT Remediation

If a student has missed the SAT preparation classes that were offered this summer through MCPS, they will have another chance to take classes this fall through MCPS. Information should be available in the career center by August.

Princeton Review Course

This year, Princeton Review course will be offered as a credited class through school. Students interested in taking this class need to contact the guidance department. The school is currently

working on an on-line Princeton review program.

College/Career Evening and Financial Aid Workshop

The College/Career Evening is scheduled for October 12 with an alternate date of October 14. The Financial Aid Workshop is scheduled for December 2 with a snow date of December 6.

New SAT Information

The new SAT will be administered for the first time in March 2005 for the class of 2006 (2003-04 sophomores). Some of the changes to the SAT include:

- A student-written essay
- Analogies eliminated
- Shorter reading passages added
- New content from third-year college preparatory math
- Quantitative Comparisons eliminated

Major changes include:

- **Writing**
-Multiple-choice questions (grammar and usage)
-Student-written essay
- **Critical Reading**
-Analogies eliminated
-Short reading passages added to existing long reading passages
- **Mathematics**
-Math content expanded to include topics from third-year college preparatory math.
-Quantitative comparisons eliminated

Why Does the College Board Say They Have Changed the SAT Test?

The SAT assesses student reasoning based on knowledge and skills developed by the student in school coursework. The new SAT will improve the alignment of the test with current curriculum and institutional practices in high school and college. By including a third measure of skills, writing, the new SAT will reinforce the importance of writing throughout a student's education and will help colleges make better admissions and placement decisions.

What Will the New SAT Cost?

The test fee will increase by \$10 to \$12. The old SAT being given this fall cost

The New PSAT/NMSQT®

The new PSAT/NMSQT will be administered for the first time in the fall of 2004 and will be excellent practice for the new SAT.

The ACT Addition

ACT will add a 30-minute Writing Test as an optional component to the ACT Assessment beginning in February 2005 for students testing within the United States who are applying to college for the fall of 2006 or later.

The ACT Writing Test will complement the English Test. The combined information from both tests will tell postsecondary institutions about students' understanding of the conventions of standard written English and their ability to produce a direct sample of writing. ✦

Kennedy's New Obligations Policy

Kennedy High School will collect student obligations on a more consistent basis. All students are expected to pay their obligations at the time they incur them or by the end of the semester in which they occur. Students with outstanding obligations must see their grade level administrator to pay, partially pay or establish a payment plan that will address this debt. Students who wish to participate in special events such as homecoming, who wish to purchase a parking space and who wish to participate in extracurricular events must make arrangements to address their previous debts before proceeding with these activities. ✦

Foreign Language Department

The Foreign Language Department works towards success for all students. Teachers carefully monitor student progress and work closely with parents. They are available before and after school for additional academic support.

Studying a foreign language requires discipline and commitment on the part of the teacher and student. Language needs constant practice for mastery. The five basic skills of language learning are: listening, speaking, reading, writing, and understanding the culture of the people about whom we are studying. The experience of learning another language should be exciting and enjoyable.

Our school offers Spanish (all levels: 1-AP Lang. & Lit., and Cambridge Spanish), French (all levels: 1-AP Lang.), Japanese (levels 1-4), and Latin (levels 1 & 2). Our FL department has dedicated teachers. Their goal is to help our students become lifelong learners who are sensitive to the cultural and linguistic heritage of other groups, understand their influence on American culture, and become prepared to participate in multilingual communities.

We believe that all students will learn the foreign language of their choice. Our hope is that they will be active learners—use the target language as much as possible, share ideas, ask questions, compare what they learn with real life, and be willing to take the risk of making a few mistakes. ✦

Critical Thinking and Analysis

When we involve students in artistic problem solving, we invite their participation as partners in the learning process. Instead of being told what to think, the visual arts require students to sort out their own reactions and articulate them through the materials at hand. Their attention and focus become absorbed into the task so that they learn from individual reflection rather than from the outside. They discover the answers for themselves through their own critical thinking. Such solutions require higher order thinking, analysis, and judgment, and students tend to stay on task because they are creating their own work, not replicating someone else's. Being able to think independently is the basis of problem solving. It is also an engaging way to learn.

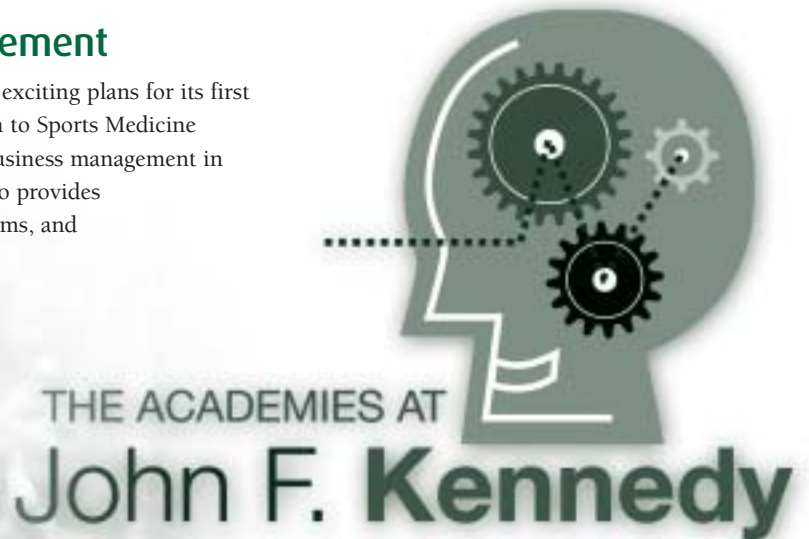

CAMBRIDGE ACADEMY

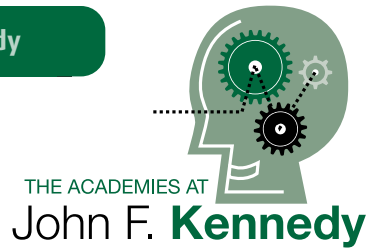
